Last Month, ETQG hosted an Affordable Rental Housing Workshop. We had a great turnout and are thankful to all our speakers and attendees who took the time out of their day to discuss rental housing issues in East Tennessee.

Brief overview of the workshop: The workshop began with a welcome by Monty Ross, the Executive Director of East Tennessee Regional Leadership Association and a member of the ETQG's Board of Directors. Executive Committee. After the welcome, Joe Speer and Katie Moore with the Tennessee Housing Development Agency gave a presentation on the rental housing status of the region and highlighted agency assistance programs. Following THDA's presentation, Diane Davidson, a member of ETQG's Board of Directors, Executive Committee, lead a White Boarding Q & A session, where attendees identified affordable rental housing problems. The workshop ended with a panel discussion addressing affordable housing issues lead by, Kathy Trawick -- Executive Director of the Tennessee Fair Housing Council, Chris Osborn--COO of Home Source. Chris Martin-- President of the the Knoxville Leadership Foundation and

Housing Preservation Grants

The US Department of Agriculture and Rural Development is providing grants to sponsor organizations for the repair and rehabilitation of housing owned or occupied by low and very low income rural citizens. USDA will award a total of \$10 million in Housing Preservation Grant Program funding for the repair and rehabilitation of rural housing units. The deadline to apply is August 9th. More Than 500 Units of Workforce Housing to be Built in Sevier County

In November 2016, Sevier County suffered through the loss of thousands of structures by a deadly wildfire, depleting an already low supply of available rental housing. The area is still in recovery but thanks to the Tennessee Housing Development Agency, Sevier County will be getting more than 500 units of affordable rental housing in the next few years. This will be made possible through Low Income Housing Tax Credits the THDA is providing

Climate Resiliency Training in East Tennessee
